

Homes for Independent Living of Wisconsin operates over 100 community-based residential locations providing support to approximately 350 clients in northeastern, southeastern and central Wisconsin.

Prader-Willi Homes supports approximately 80 adults with Prader-Willi Syndrome in community settings in and near Oconomowoc, Wisconsin.

Paragon Community Services offers programs serving approximately 350 adults, young adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities through Adult Day Services and Paragon Activity Club (PAC) youth respite services. Plus community and facility based time-limited prevocational skills programs and employment services with both leading to competitive integrated employment.

Genesee Lake School provides education, therapeutic and vocational services for approximately 90 students in its residential program and nearly 40 students in its day school in Wisconsin.

The Richardson School operates five Therapeutic Day Schools serving over 180 students, ages 5-21 with emotional, neurological, and/or developmental disabilities throughout eastern Wisconsin.

Genesee Community Services provides Applied Behavioral Services (ABA) to nearly 70 families in Waukesha, Jefferson and Milwaukee Counties and ABA services to children in a clinic setting under the age of six.

T.C. Harris School and Academy serves

approximately 70 students through a residential school and day school in Lafayette, Indiana.

Transitions Academy of Indiana serves

approximately 70 youth with significant emotional, behavioral and mental health challenges in a secure treatment setting in Indianapolis, Indiana.
